

**Cornville Community Association
General Meeting
January 14, 2009**

The General meeting of the Cornville Community Association (CCA) was held at 7:00pm, Wednesday, January 14, 2009, at the Oak Creek Elementary School Gymnasium, 11490 E. Purple Sage Rd., Cornville, Arizona 86325.

Deanna King called the meeting to order at 7:06p. Everyone was welcomed and said the Pledge of Allegiance.

Treasurer's Report: Deanna King reported the new ending balance was \$1278.68.

Membership: Russ Bottjer reported there are about 90 paid members of the 2009 CCA. 2008 members are encouraged to renew 2009 memberships soon. Cost is \$10.00 individual or \$15 family.

Community Spirit: Lois Hook reported the November Pot Luck was a wonderful success. Thanks to all who donated prizes for the drawings, as the drawings were highly anticipated and exciting for all. The Annual Easter Egg Hunt is just around the corner, and candy and volunteer time are the only requested donations. The Marine Corps Toys4Tots was a success. The Cornville Farmer's Market will again be held for 2009 every Monday evening at Windmill Park starting sometime this spring. 2030 Traffic Analysis, Plans, & Goals: George Dana reported four projected changes to affect Cornville traffic: 1.) Cornville Road from Tissaw to Hwy.89A will be four lanes. 2.) There will be a bypass from Tissaw to Bill Grey Road. 3.) Beaverhead Flat Road will extend to Hwy. 260. 4.) Beaver Creek and Cornville are the projected growth targets for County development. Trails: Paul Graham reported the government-funded trail studies are out of money, but none of the studies are completed. We have demanded to know where the money allocated for the studies went. Expenditure reports were promised, but have still not been delivered. Apparently Mr. Stafford of the U.S. Forest Service, who was in charge to some degree, decided to retire in October, 2008 when the studies ran out of money, and he took the data with him. Attempts to re-establish communications with him have failed thus far. The goal was (and is still) to eventually establish an interconnected and comprehensive Verde Valley Trail System.

Verde Valley Land Preservation Institute: Bob Rothrock, president, described the purpose, plans, and achievements of this all-volunteer organization. Please see the attached presentation below.
