

## **Cornville Community Association**

### **General Meeting**

**Wednesday, February 11, 2009**

The General meeting of the Cornville Community Association (CCA) was held at 7:00pm, Wednesday, February 11, 2009, at the Oak Creek Elementary School Gymnasium, 11490 E. Purple Sage Rd., Cornville, Arizona 86325.

Deanna King called the meeting to order at 7:07p. Everyone was welcomed and said the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Treasurer's Report:** Beginning balance was \$1278.68. There were deposits of \$1333.00 and withdrawals of \$423.00 leaving an ending balance of \$2188.68.

**Membership:** Russ Bottjer reported there are about 142 paid members of the 2009 CCA. This is about 85 members down from last year. 2008 members are encouraged to renew 2009 memberships soon. Cost is \$10.00 individual or \$15 family.

**Community Spirit:** Lois Hook reported the Annual Easter Egg Hunt is coming early in April this year. The Hunt still needs candy, prizes, and volunteers for parking patrol, egg hiding, and egg stuffing duties. We expect about 200 kids this year (limited to 7 years of age and younger). The Hunt will be held the Saturday before Easter and is BYOB (bring your own baskets). Each child will also get a raffle ticket, and select eggs will contain raffle tickets good for a chance for the bigger prizes.

Lois Hook also reported the Cornville Farmer's Market will again be held Monday evenings this year beginning in May.

**Elections:** Ted Luke, Deanna King, Lois Hook, and George Dana are coming to the end of their terms. Nominees for the CCA Board of Directors should be submitted by March 11, 2009.

**Verde Valley Caregivers Coalition:** Barbara Lattrel, Executive Director, presented the basic concepts involved with their group.

**Annexation:** Cottonwood is going to succeed with their annexation even though some of their land is already spoken for in our Cornville Community Plan. This will be the topic of a presentation by Judy Miller to the CCA Planning & Zoning Committee at their March Meeting. It seems state law is in Cottonwood's favor, and since there's no people living there, there is no need for a 51% majority vote. Come to the P&Z Meeting in March for more details.
