

**Cornville Community Association**  
**General Meeting**  
**Annual Meeting**  
**August 13, 2008**

The General meeting of the Cornville Community Association (CCA) was held at 7:00pm, Wednesday, August 13, 2008, at the Oak Creek Elementary School Gymnasium, 11490 E. Purple Sage Rd., Cornville, Arizona 86325. There were 100 attendees and 5 guests.

Deanna King called the meeting to order. Everyone was welcomed and said the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the June and July General Meetings were approved.

**Treasurer's Report:** As of July 31, 2008, the current balance is \$3238.75 after deposits of \$25 and withdrawals of \$0. Beginning balance was \$3213.75. The CCA took in an additional \$53.00 in donations to the Pass-Around Jar at the last General Meeting. Thanks to the donors.

**Membership:** Russ Bottjer reported there are currently 222 paid members of the 2008 CCA.

**Community Spirit:** Lois Hook reported the Farmers Market being held Monday's at Windmill Park at 5:00pm has been a huge success. There are no prepared foods allowed—only produce, please.

**Cornville Multi-Use Path:** Mike Willet, Assistant Public Works Director, detailed the latest developments. Costs are escalating, but they hope to submit a design to ADOT this fall. Please see attached presentation below.

**Area Roads:** Verl Cook, District 3 Roads Superintendent, described current efforts affecting the Verde Valley. They are clearing culverts, and chip-sealing is progressing. There are sandbags available at the Fire Department to help with any flooding, but everyone has to fill bags themselves. There is still no timeline for the widening of Cornville Road. **County Supervisor's Report:** Chip Davis covered many topics affecting Cornville residents. Verde River Days will be held at Dead Horse Ranch State Park September 27, 2008. Project Wet for area fourth graders will be held at Dead Horse Ranch State Park October 23, 2008. The Sustainable Planning Committee is pushing an agenda to allow landowners to subdivide at will. The new Open Space Subdivision Ordinance would also eliminate the entire current public review process for these new subdivisions. It was noted that Elise Link is the individual responsible for this attempt to circumvent our current county Planning & Zoning process.
