General Meeting

October 8, 2008

The General meeting of the Cornville Community Association (CCA) was held at 7:00pm, Wednesday, October 8, 2008, at the Oak Creek Elementary School Gymnasium, 11490 E. Purple Sage Rd., Cornville, Arizona 86325.

Deanna King called the meeting to order at 7:12p. Everyone was welcomed and said the Pledge of Allegiance.

Bev Dana Memorial Service Fund: A donation was taken up for Bev Dana's memorial service. All donations were matched by the Cornville Community Association.

Treasurer's Report: Ted Luke reported the beginning balance was \$3189.98. There were \$28.35 in deposits and \$215.00 in withdrawals. New ending balance was \$3003.33.

Membership: Russ Bottjer reported there are currently 223 paid members of the 2008 CCA.

Switch to Digital TV: The Verde Valley is a 'translator station', so the community is not switching to digital signal transmission at this time. The Verde Valley will switch from analog TV transmission to digital TV transmission at a later date.

Community Spirit: Lois Hook reported the Cottonwood Fire Department is selling TIP calendars for \$15.00 each. There are also t-shirts for sale. The November pot luck details are complete. The pot luck will be a western-style chili cook-off with Mr. and Mrs. Chip Davis judging the entries. Sign up with Lois to join the contest. The band will be Ricker's Pickers, and it will be held in the Oak Creek Elementary School Gymnasium. Last year, 110 people attended.

Candidate Forum: Assistant Chief Flummer introduced the candidates for the Fire Department Board of Directors, and they each described their qualifications.
