

**Cornville Community Association  
General Meeting  
February 13, 2008**

The regular General meeting of the Cornville Community Association was held at 7:00pm, Wednesday, February 13, 2008, at the Oak Creek Elementary School Gymnasium, 11490 E. Purple Sage Rd., Cornville, Arizona 86325. There were 62 members present with 10 guests from Northern Arizona University (NAU).

Deanna King called the meeting to order, and introduced Judy Miller after the Pledge of Allegiance.

Judy Miller provided a minor background to the proposed extension of Windmill Park, the NAU/Cornville Center Project, and then introduced Dr. Charles Hammersley, Professor of Parks & Recreational Design & Planning at NAU. County Supervisor Chip Davis was also in attendance.

**Cornville Park Focus Meeting Implemented by NAU Parks & Recreation Facilities Planning:**  
Dr. Hammersley presented the format for the meeting:

This meeting is only the first step in a long process involving the Cornville Community.

It was stressed that this was not the time for voting or debate. This was just to generate possible ideas which would be gathered together and organized for presentation at the next General meeting in March, 2008. At that time, more feedback would be generated so that a final conceptual design could be presented at the April General meeting.

The attendees split into groups of twelve participants each moderated and recorded by NAU students.

The purpose of the focus groups was to explore options and ideas for the proposed park. This was accomplished through the discussion of eleven main questions (*see # 1-11 below*). The questions were addressed individually toward each of four quadrants (*see Q, R, S, & T on map below*) totaling the entire 80 acre project.

A copy of the questions and the map involved is included below.

The meeting was adjourned about 8:45pm.
