The meeting was then turned over to Supervisor Chip Davis who introduced two candidates running for State Representatives for District 1. Noel Campbell and Karen Fann. Chip then introduced the speakers:

- Geoff Meek, Environmental Unit Manager did a PowerPoint Presentation on Septic Tanks and how to care for them. Remember to space out your laundry loads.
- Barry Allan and Rex Bergamini spoke about the Oak Creek Watershed Council. The Council was formed to deal with the E coli in Oak Creek. They will start testing spots once a week along Oak Creek in June and continue through October. In hopes to find the source of the contaminant. The number one ecoli strand is from skunks followed by raccoons, elk, cattle and then humans. Cornville is safe at this point in time.
- Bob Burke, Master Gardener did a PowerPoint Presentation a plant combinations that are beneficial for keeping weeds down, bad insects out and good insects in your gardens. Vinegar will also help with weeds.
- Lt. Jay Parkison, Sheriff's Office gave an update on the activities/calls from the Cornville area.
- Verl Cook, Area Roads Superintendent gave an update on the Roads activities in Cornville.
- Supervisor Davis gave an update on the County Budget, Centennial, Arizona State Parks, Page Springs Road Dedication, and Capital improvement projects.
