

## CORNVILLE ASSOCIATION MINUTES FEB. 9, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 7 PM by Pres. Deanna King; pledge of allegiance followed. Treasurer Ted Luke reported that we have a \$2707.00 balance. There were 56 people in attendance.

Lois reported that Community Pride committee is working on Egg Hunt (April 23) and that they still need donations for bikes. Drop off cans are located in several Cornville businesses, as well as the Fire Dept. on Page Springs Rd. Also, the Food Bank is having a Valentine's Dinner fundraiser Sunday, Feb. 13. Debbi reported 180 members to date, plus new applications received at the meeting.

Deanna announced the Drug Drop Off Day, Feb 19 at the fire house and encouraged residents to get rid of Over-the-Counter drugs that are outdated. She also reminded the members of the Annual meeting in April and that there are four board seats open. Ted Luke added his name to the candidate list, Debbi Segall won't be running again and Deanna said she would not be running again. The Millers reported on the cleanup progress of the Stewards of Public Lands. They will be working this Sat., Feb. 12 in the Green Gate area. Russ Bottjer thanked those who helped on the Cornville Rd. cleanup on Jan. 29.

Our speaker, Mike Willett, of Yavapai County, presented a Power Point program on the progress of our trails. The Cornville Multi-Use Trail has the 30% design review completed, and the Cohnville Trail has the approval of the County Board of Supervisors and the Forest Service. The NEPA study will begin soon. There was discussion regarding the history of Cornville, Cohnville or Coneville. A group will meet to determine the correctness of the trail designation.

Mike then presented the maps/diagrams of the road reconstruction plan for 2.9 miles starting at Aspaas Rd. and continuing to Tissaw Rd. There will be turn lanes and a raised median for improved safety. Bids for this begin March 1, and construction will begin in May. The project will cost \$3.5 million.

The meeting adjourned at 8 PM and members were able to walk around and look at the maps and drawings for the reconstructing on Cornville Road and ask questions.
