

Cornville Community Association, Inc
General Meeting
Wednesday, October 13, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President Deanna King at 7:00 pm. Board members present were, Deanna King, Lois Hook, Ted Luke, Paul Graham, Gregg Law, Nikki Lewis. Absent, Jan Thomlison and Debbi Segall

Deanna mentioned meeting guidelines, and lead Pledge of Allegiance.

Ted Luke gave financial report. We have a balance of \$3,764.83 earning \$5.36 in interest.

Lois Hook reminded everyone of the annual Pot Luck on November 10. We are going back to the old fashioned turkey and ham with all the side dishes. Music and a raffle are planned. Look for fliers and news releases.

Russ Bottjer talked about the Adopt-a- Highway cleanup. Would like to have one the first Saturday in November, which would be the 6th. Look for information on web page and Cornville chronicle.

County Supervisor Chip Davis introduced two local Cornville County workers, Steve Mauk and Verl Cook. Then he introduced Public Works Director with an update on the Cornville Multi-Use-Path and the Cohnville Stage Trail. He said the MUP, will start at 89A and go past Verde Santa Fe to a trail head, park& ride. An agreement with the Forest Service for funds will get the Cohnville trail started again.

Steve Mauk, Director of Development Services said they handle all activities for the County, are setting up a web site so all event applications will be on line. General Plan will done in house and will have 9 meetings between January and February for public participation. They have reduced staff 40% but have consolidated departments and seem to be running more efficient.

Kent Ellsworth- Director Verde Valley Caregivers talked about what they provide to about 1012 residents of the Verde, have 220 volunteers and need about 280. The volunteers drive them to Dr. appointments, shopping, and sometimes just sit and visit with them.

Verl Cook, Area Roads Superintendent discussed chip sealing roads, and they like to do that every 5-6 years. Patching and cutting down the over grown brush. When they will clean ditches and when they don't. Talked about the cost of permits: landscaping \$40, breakaway mailboxes \$10 and for a driveway \$10.

Supervisor Chip Davis discussed the County budget and the possibility of the County going to 5 supervisor's with population hitting close to 200,000 in Yavapai County. With over 70,000 people in Verde in might be split into two districts. They will meet

with the public for their input. There is a new Health Clinic being built near the County building. More people requesting assistance because of the economy downturn. He had a power point presentation of the breakdown of County funds and where our money is going.
